Our Healthier South East London – Governing Body update April 2015

This briefing is for CCGs to share with their Governing Body members as a monthly update on the *Our Healthier South East London* programme.

Strategy development progress

The current phase of the strategy programme continues to focus on testing and modelling the impact of the whole system model and the individual clinical models; on establishing outcome measures for the whole system model; and on ensuring alignment with operational plans as they are developed.

The target model for CBC has been further developed and tested through the Partnership Group and the Clinical Executive Group and it was very positively received in both.

Issues Paper

The programme published an *Issues Paper* on the website www.ourhealthiersel.nhs.uk on March 28. This sets out a range of issues facing the NHS in south east London. It is not a public consultation document, but shares some of our initial ideas to improve the local NHS. It summarises the case for change and sets out the national and London-wide context.

The Issues Paper will be used to support wide engagement and we are encouraging local people to share their thoughts and consider the questions we have set out. The paper will be printed and circulated more widely during May and June 2015.

We are also developing a summary and an Easy Read version which will be circulated alongside the longer document and will be available online this month.

A film introducing the programme and the case for change has been produced and is also available on our website. This will be used in public meetings and can be viewed by people wishing to better understand the aims of the programme. We intend that this is the first in a series of films which will explore different aspects of the programme.

Engagement update

Patient and Public Advisory Group (PPAG)

The PPAG meeting on April 15 included a programme update; a reflective discussion on the workforce supporting strategy; and a detailed look at the engagement materials produced by partners Innovation Unit. The meeting was well attended and discussions were lively. Feedback from the group will be fed back into the strategy and workstreams for consideration.
